Executive summary

The 2023/24 Winter Plan sets out how the City Council plans to respond to the ongoing pressures on residents caused by the cost of living crisis over the next five months. It contains four sections; partnerships, children and families, energy and housing, immediate support and how we will raise awareness of the support on offer.

1. Proposed Decision

1.1 That the 2023/24 Winter Plan (set out at Annex A), be noted.

2. Why is the decision needed?

2.1 The cost of living crisis continues to place pressure on many household budgets. Inflation remains well above the government target and although some areas of expenditure, such as energy prices, have reduced over the last six months, they remain at an elevated level.
