



**LOCAL GOVERNMENT (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT 1982
APPLICATION FOR A STREET TRADING CONSENT (NEW)**

Adopted Highways within the Borough of Milton Keynes have been designated as Consent Streets (unless they are already Prohibited). Trading on or within 60 metres of the centre of one of these streets is not permitted without the written consent of the Council.

Consents may only be granted for Street Trading on the streets designated as Consent Streets by Milton Keynes Council. A list of such streets can be obtained at www.milton-keynes.gov.uk/Licensing and clicking on the Street Trading link.

Consents may be granted initially for a maximum of 3 hours trading in every 24 hours although you can apply for more hours after 21 days of trading. All consents are renewable annually and can only be given to persons aged seventeen and over. Commercial need will be a relevant consideration when considering the application.
